
praise turned to one of victory as Israel's enemies turned against each other. God triumphed for His people, as He always intends to.

But faith easily turns to false confidence. Jehoshaphat made an unholy alliance with Ahaziah, the evil king of Israel, and incurred God's righteous judgment. Judah's spiritual advance became a decline.

But God raised up Hezekiah, who led the greatest spiritual revival in Israel's history. He purged the land of idols and purified the Lord's temple. When the Assyrians marched through the Middle East, destroyed Israel's Northern Kingdom and surrounded Jerusalem, Hezekiah went to God. "And the Lord sent an angel who destroyed every mighty warrior, commander and officer in the camp of the king of Assyria" (32:21).

God consistently showed His faithfulness when His people trusted Him. But in the end, sinful humanity turns away from God, not toward Him. Late in life, Hezekiah became proud and invited God's judgment on his kingdom. Manasseh, his heir, turned from God to destruction.

Are you frustrated by your failings? Just when you see hints of spiritual growth, do you find yourself slipping back? Do you say with Paul, "The good that I wish, I do not do; but I practice the very evil that I do not wish" (Romans 7:19). Welcome to humanity! But let God teach you from your experience and from His Word. No human has ever lived a completely righteous life.

Except One. Jesus Christ has succeeded where everyone else fails. The great miracle of His life is His perfect obedience to God, even when it meant surrender to death. He overcame the frustration of human failure and became the only perfect person humanity had to offer. And He offered Himself as the perfect sacrifice to pay for our sin. Once again, God has stepped in to save His people.

All Scripture points to Jesus Christ. Look to Him and live.

*Wretched man that I am! Who will set me free from this body of death?
Thanks be to God through Jesus Christ our Lord! –Romans 7:24-25*

Dilemma and Deliverance

All who desire to live a righteous life will be frustrated. Experience proves this statement true and confirms the Biblical record. Righteousness is a necessity, but achieving it is an impossibility. As one song puts it, "Perfection is my enemy." The harder we try to achieve it, the more we fall short of our goal.

We're not alone. The heroes of Scripture give us company. They bear witness to our lot and identify with our frustration and failure. 2nd Chronicles is stuffed with examples. But this overwhelming spiritual frustration only underscores God's magnificent grace in redemption.

The book starts with Solomon, heir to the legacy of David. He started off well, beginning with a humble request for wisdom to lead God's people. And God used Solomon to establish Israel's golden age and build a magnificent temple to His glory. Under Solomon, the Lord was exalted, and the world took notice. "All the kings of the earth were seeking the presence of Solomon to hear the wisdom which God had put in his heart" (9:23).

With Solomon, God's promise to bless the world through Israel seemed to come true. But it is not within humanity to achieve the promises of God. Solomon succumbed to idolatry. His son, Rehoboam, divided Israel and squandered the legacy of his father and grandfather. So much for the promise of humanity.

But faithful kings, who trusted God for great things, followed Solomon. Faithful Jehoshaphat for example. Three neighboring countries ganged up on Israel. He was understandably afraid but "turned his attention to seek the Lord; and proclaimed a fast through all Judah" (20:3).

Jehoshaphat trusted in the Lord and led his people to do the same. As he led his army to battle against overwhelming odds, Jehoshaphat gave the order to begin praising God. Their song of
