
This strange set of affairs—our longing for life and willingness to inflict death on the innocent—makes no sense. But the Bible explains that it comes from our alienation from God, the Source of life. We brought death when we sinned against Him. That's the ugly spiritual truth about our race.

We deserve death. It is the natural consequence of our disobedience and God's just judgment on our actions. As awful as shed blood is—as much physical pain and emotional turmoil as it brings, the shedding of blood represents the justice of God. Sin is awful. It defies God and destroys man. God cannot let it stand. God must judge sin. Blood must be shed.

Blood brings hope. All that blood in Old Testament worship belonged to a substitute. God had a plan, which lay hidden in His worship. Someone else would pay for our sins with His blood. A day would come when God would provide complete forgiveness through the blood of His Son. The rivers of blood coming from untold thousands of bulls and goats and lambs killed in the Old Testament would become the wine—the fruit of the vine—Christ offered in the New Testament.

As you read Leviticus this month, notice man's sin. Notice all the blood that was shed for forgiveness. Notice and give thanks. Jesus did not shrink back in horror from shedding His blood. He laid down His life for our sin. His blood satisfied the Father's just wrath, so we can know the His infinite love.

(Year ONE) May 2018

When every commandment had been spoken by Moses to all the people according to the Law, he took the blood of the calves and the goats, with water and scarlet wool and hyssop, and sprinkled both the book itself and all the people, saying, "This is the blood of the covenant, which God commanded you." And in the same way he sprinkled both the tabernacle and all the vessels of the ministry with the blood. And according to the Law, one may almost say, all things are cleansed with blood, and without shedding of blood there is no forgiveness. —Hebrews 9:19-22

Our Hope

The sight of blood gives a shock. Blood symbolizes pain and harm. It grosses us out. We turn away from blood with a wince. So why does blood figure so prominently in Old Testament worship?

Blood stands for life. "The life of the flesh is in the blood" (Leviticus 17:11). As long as blood stays in the body, it delivers life-giving nourishment and oxygen to each member and cleans waste from the system. Damage to the body causes blood to flow, and losing too much blood inevitably leads to death. This physical fact leads us to the spiritual significance of blood throughout God's Word.

We are dead in our sins. This fact is hard to recognize, when 7 billion people are swarming all over the earth. But 4,500 years of human history give abundant evidence of a profound dysfunction in our race. All the people living and moving on this planet mask the dreaded reality each one must face. Death. No one leaves this world alive. Death is God's judgment on our sin. God's Word helps us to make sense out of this world. While we long for life, we cannot avoid death, and what is more, we inflict death on others (or at least we'd like to from time to time).
