Praying the Truth of God's Presence with Us

The truth is always that we never lack anything we need, no matter what, because the Creator of heaven and earth and the Redeemer of fallen humanity is always with us. Tell Him all you need.

His Care and Direction: He makes me lie down in green pastures. He leads me beside still waters. God's plans for us are good and sure. He is the Lord of our refreshment. He gives rest and renewal. Cast your cares on Him.

His Correction: He restores my soul. He leads me in paths of righteousness for his name's sake. Our Shepherd knows the path we should take and leads us without fail. When we stray, He faithfully and lovingly turns us back to the right path. See Gods good purpose in whatever happens. Trust Him to lead you well.

His Protection: Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil, for you are with me. Life is filled with difficulties and dangers. Our Father does not cause them but He guides us through them and keeps us safe. Learn to receive His peace in every circumstance.

His Authority: *your rod and your staff, they comfort me.* We are fallen creatures in a broken world. The Lord provides the correction we need, even when we don't want it. Our safety is in His strength when He corrects us as well as when He protects us. Accept the Father's discipline as an expression of His love.

His Abundance in Adversity: You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies. This world is not our home. Whether we realize it or not, we live out our lives in hostile territory. The threat of those who hate God and oppose us serves only to remind us of that fact. But they can never separate us from the Shepherd's loving care (Romans 8:38-39). Notice what God does for you in good times and bad, and give Him thanks.

His Anointing: *you anoint my head with oil; my cup overflows.* God has chosen us to be His people and called us to proclaim the Gospel. He will accomplish His purpose through His people. Trust Him to *comfort your hearts and establish them in every good work and word.* (2nd Thessalonians 2:17).

His Unfailing Goodness: Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life. Nothing will ever separate us from the Love of God in Christ Jesus. Be confident in His goodness to you. Receive His constant forgiveness. Rest in His perfect intention to perfect His plan in you (Philippians 1:6).

Our Eternal Home: and I shall dwell in the house of the LORD forever. This world is not our home, but our eternal home with our Lord and Savior is our certain destination. Set your hope fully on the grace that will be brought to you at the revelation of Jesus Christ (1st Peter 1:13).
