
When our eyes are off God, reality gets distorted. We forget our God is the creator of heaven and earth. We lose sight of the fact that the winds and waves still know His voice and respond instantly to His command. But God dominates the perspective of those who trust Him. Waiting on Him makes everything shrink to a size we know He can manage. Faith makes fear flee.

David also understood how to view the present in light of the past. "When evildoers came upon me to devour my flesh, my adversaries and my enemies, they stumbled and fell. Though a host encamp against me, my heart will not fear. Though war arise against me, in spite of this, I shall be confident" (27:2-3). David used the help God gave him in the past as the basis for his confidence in the future.

David also learned that there is nothing more important or more valuable than his relationship with God. "One thing that I have asked from the Lord and that I shall seek: that I may dwell in the house of the Lord all the days of my life, to behold the beauty of the Lord and to meditate in His temple" (27:4). We always make ourselves vulnerable when there's something in our lives we value more than God Himself. All things come from God. How can anything be more precious than Him? God uses waiting to loosen our grip on the idols of this earth, so our hands are free to embrace Him.

Let's say with David, "Teach me Your way O Lord, and lead me in a level path" (27:10). David waited years before God made him king as He had promised. God's promise never failed. Israel waited over a millennium for their Messiah to come, and come He did, not in triumph but as a sacrificial lamb. He didn't give His disciples anything of this world. He gave us access into the next. And before He ascended to be with His Father, He promised to send His Spirit. But His people had to wait for God's time. And they did. Then, after that, God used them to remake the world.

Those who wait for the Lord will gain new strength. They will mount up with wings like eagles. They will run and not get tired. They will walk and not become weary. –Isaiah 40:31

Waiting on the Promises

It's always a challenge in the Christian life to let God be God. It's one of those things that goes most contrary to our nature. So, naturally, it's an area God works on. After all, what destroyed our original bond with our Creator was that refusal in the garden to trust Him and obey His will.

So, is it any wonder why God is content to let His timing differ from ours? We're in a hurry, He's not. We stamp our foot in impatience. He bides His time. We rush, He delays. The more frantic we get, the less He responds. Hm...is God up to something?

Of course He is. God knows exactly what He's doing, and the more out of touch He seems, the more we can know there's something we need to learn that He's determined to teach. And whatever the details are, the ultimate lesson God has to teach is submission to His will. Trust and obey. Let God be God. And nothing builds the submission muscle like waiting.

Faith is at the heart of waiting, because no one waits without expecting something to happen. Waiting helps us to expect God to act for our good, but in His time and for His purposes. It is essential for training us to let go of our will and our way and surrender to God's will and His way.

Psalms 27 provides several insights into the waiting process. King David, an experienced "waiter," exhorts, "Wait for the Lord; be strong and let your heart take courage; yes, wait for the Lord" (27:14). Here are some dynamics of the waiting process that transform it from a trying experience into a growing experience.

First of all, David let God's greatness dominate his perspective. "The Lord is my light and my salvation; whom shall I fear? The Lord is the defense of my life; whom shall I dread?" (27:1). Being absorbed by our trouble fuels our panic. We let what we fear dominate our focus, and it gets bigger and bigger.
