
He descended to a place of pain and disease. Absolutely pure, He entered a world of toxic evil.

Alone in the world, Jesus faced the powers of darkness and the absolute hatred of sinful man. With nothing but love for humanity, He accepted our rejection. Even though He was entirely innocent, He faced the infinite wrath of a holy God. One with His Father, He allowed Himself to be forsaken.

The Bible describes the physical effects of His act of obedience (Luke 22:39-46). He writhed on the ground in anguished prayer. Blood seeped out of His pores from his inner struggle. He didn't want to obey and told God His preference. "Remove this cup from me." God's will repulsed Him.

But He obeyed. When He surrendered to the Roman soldiers, Jesus entrusted Himself to His Father's good will. As the executioners stretched out His arms to nail them to the cross, He was embracing God's eternal plan. And with it, all who would come to Him.

The first garden explains the world we live in. Have you been to a funeral lately? Had your heart tugged by tragedy close to home or been grieved by news of some innocent soul caused to bear the unbearable, endure the unendurable? Have you cried out, "Why!" over corruption or evil that goes unchecked? Starvation? Injustice? Oppression? Hatred or slaughter?

Every travesty on earth, each pain suffered, every evil endured has its origin in the first garden—in Adam's simple, avoidable choice to taste that fruit in direct defiance of God's will.

But the man trembling in the second garden defied the forces of hell. His surrender conquered all evil. God's obedient Son is Man's true champion and eternal hope. By Jesus' obedience, we who believe will live forever (1st Corinthians 15:21-22).

That is the story of history and the heart of God's Word.

Not My will, but Yours be done. –Luke 22:42

A Tale of Two Gardens

The Bible is the story of all time. Its history recounts events from the dawn of the world. Its prophecies unveil events at the end of this world and give glimpses of the next. But most importantly, it puts all reality into true perspective. History is the love story of God for man.

The Bible's true story can well be described as a tale of two gardens. All of history revolves around two men who each made a choice in a garden. Each decision has implications that reverberate through all time, across the globe and affect our lives today.

The first man lived in paradise. Food was abundant. His every view was a feast to the eye. He knew perfect health and had no concept of pain, illness, hunger, or lack. Everything about his world suited him completely, and his Creator was a word away.

This man was entirely innocent and lived in a world without evil. Everything he knew and desired was only good. The same was true of his wife, who was perfect in every way. No aspect of life, offered them a wrong choice—except for one.

In His infinite love and wisdom, God gave this first man a prohibition. He denied him the fruit of one of the countless trees in his garden paradise. What kind of fruit it was doesn't matter. The nature of the tree is irrelevant, but the command not to eat its fruit was crucial. It represented the question of authority—who would be in charge—and embodied two essentials of fellowship with God—trust and obedience.

Adam didn't trust or obey. In essence, the first man said to God, "Not Your will but mine be done." He severed his ties to the Lord who gave him life. Death has reigned on earth ever since.

Adam needed nothing, but he grasped for more. He had no complaint but felt God was holding out on him. He possessed no sin nature but knowingly violated God's will. In Adam, every human sinned. In him, we all died (Romans 5:12).

But there's a second garden in history. The man in this garden left paradise. He said good-bye to the abundance of God's presence to face a choice that brought unbearable anguish. From perfect paradise,
