

The Bride of Christ

Look carefully then how you walk, not as unwise but as wise, making the best use of the time, because the days are evil. Therefore do not be foolish, but understand what the will of the Lord is. And do not get drunk with wine, for that is debauchery, but be filled with the Spirit, addressing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody to the Lord with your heart, giving thanks always and for everything to God the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, submitting to one another out of reverence for Christ.

Wives, submit to your own husbands, as to the Lord. For the husband is the head of the wife even as Christ is the head of the church, his body, and is himself its Savior. Now as the church submits to Christ, so also wives should submit in everything to their husbands. —Ephesians 5:15-24

At Northpoint Church these days, we have the perfect opportunity to be the Church and allow God to define who we are as a body, so we can build ourselves up in love. The first thing we need to remember is that we are Christ's Bride—the object of His intense, purposeful love.

All earthly analogies are inadequate to portray just how much Christ loves us, but "doing church" means preparing for the day, when Jesus comes for us. Our Lord has a glorious vision of His bride, and He is committed to see that vision become a reality. We join in His perfecting process through prayer.

Christ's Vision for His Bride

Holy and Pure: Look carefully then how you walk, not as unwise but as wise, making the best use of the time, because the days are evil.

- The fear of the LORD is the beginning of wisdom (Proverbs 9:10). Seek God first in prayer.
- We are salt and light in this evil world. Pray for our Christ-like character to stand in distinct contrast to the ways of the world.

Wise and Obedient: Therefore do not be foolish, but understand what the will of the Lord is. And do not get drunk with wine, for that is debauchery,

- God's will is *good and acceptable and perfect* (Romans12:2). Pray for wisdom to see God's goodness in everything He does and allows.
- Our purpose is holiness, not pleasure. Pray for growing obedience, with joy as a byproduct.

Delightfully Delighting in Him: but be filled with the Spirit, addressing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody to the Lord with your heart,

- Our joy is in Christ, not the world. Take time to delight in the Lord.
- Worship is more than a prelude to a sermon. It's cultivating our joy in the Lord and "rehearsing" for heaven. By every possible means repeat, reflect on, and rejoice in what is true about our Savior.

Abundantly Grateful: giving thanks always and for everything to God the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ,

- All blessings flow from God. Train your heart to be grateful.
- Gratitude is the bedrock of faith and the fountain of joy. *Give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you* (1st Thessalonians 518).

Trusting and Submissive: submitting to one another out of reverence for Christ. Wives, submit to your own husbands, as to the Lord. For the husband is the head of the wife even as Christ is the head of the church, his body, and is himself its Savior. Now as the church submits to Christ, so also wives should submit in everything to their husbands.

 The order of God's authority extends into human relationships. Pray that our church and our homes will honor Christ's rule and follow His ways.

- Define, refine, and extend our vision for serving Christ
- Follow God's call on us as a congregation, as our passions become our priorities and determine our direction.
