
The view from his Psalm is magnificent. The Lord's lovingkindness looms to heights beyond the reach of imagination. No one knew God's loyal love like David, who had seen God carry him through years of wandering as a fugitive in the desert. God's faithfulness—His utter reliability—is as measureless as the sky. Who could testify to this like Israel's shepherd king, whom God had transferred from pasture to throne, despite all odds, just as he had promised?

Against the backdrop of the evil schemes of wicked men (verses 1-4), rises the majestic mountain of God's perfect righteousness. In contrast to the cutthroat world of political intrigue, God's justice, too deep to fathom, rolls along like the vast, mysterious sea. The wicked destroy, but God "preserves man and beast."

Nothing untangles the nerves and corrects perspective like time contemplating the unchanging nature and character of God. We leave behind fickle affections, tugging us this way and that, which never last—never satisfy. We bask in the goodness of our Lord, who loved us—and will love us—to the end (John 13:1). We trade the rickety props of human security for the faithfulness of God, who has demonstrated His absolute reliability time and time again. The distractions of daily life and frustrations of trafficking with the ungodly melt away. Perfect righteousness and unflinching justice dominate our view and reassure our souls.

Don't miss your chance to visit the heights this summer. Carve out some time to spend rejoicing. See God in all that surrounds you—in all that happens around you. Notice His hand at work in your life. Remind yourself of all God has done for you—all He will do. Make a list of His blessings. Be awestruck by His goodness and staggered by His love.

A Heart with a View

The view from the top of Half Dome is magnificent. I've been up there twice, and I'd love to go again—if I can make it. The hike means leaving behind the bustle of daily life and entering the pristine wilderness of Yosemite Valley. You trade the confusion and bewilderment of city life for an arduous trek up one of the world's largest granite monoliths.

For someone like me, it's an almost insurmountable task, trudging doggedly toward the next bend in the trail, only to find the path steeper around the corner, until you're certain you will never make it. But somehow you do. There's something about focused effort that melts away all the distractions and draws you to the next step, then the next one, and the next. Time drifts absentmindedly by, until finally, you're there at the top. The dome falls away on every side, leaving you to drink in a vast panorama and stand awestruck.

El Capitan dominates your view on the left. Ridge after ridge of the High Sierras fade off into the distance on the right. Clouds that rival the vast mountains in size tower over the Merced River, as it waters the lush valley a mile beneath your feet. The tyranny of life's treadmill can wait. The to-do list can take care of itself. This staggering beauty transcends the grind. The solidity of ancient mountains, the serenity of the glacier-carved valley, they really matter.

King David took a journey one day, three thousand years ago. It wasn't a physical hike, though. It was spiritual. It was a journey of appreciation. He left behind the wiles of the wicked that had him tied up in knots and began contemplating the eternal realities of the nature of his God. He describes "the view" in Psalm 36.

*Your lovingkindness, O Lord extends to the heavens,
Your faithfulness reaches to the clouds.
Your righteousness is like the mountain of God,
Your judgments are a great deep.
O Lord, you preserve man and beast.*
