
And the prophets we've been reading were His hunting dogs. He sent them on ahead to turn His people back to Himself. The name, "Zechariah" means, "God remembers." Miraculously, Israel returned from exile after seventy years of captivity, just as Jeremiah predicted.

While God remembered how much He loved His people and wanted a place to dwell with them, they forgot their God. Zechariah and Haggai preached persistently, until God's people put less money into their new homes and dedicated enough of their earnings to rebuild the temple.

Through Malachi, the last of the Old Testament prophets, God reached out to Israel again. They wearied quickly of following His laws. Malachi helped them reconnect the blessings they experienced the God who gave them.

Both Malachi and Zechariah predicted the coming Messiah, whom Israel would reject once again. *He came unto His own, and those who were His own did not receive Him* (John 1:11). Still His pursuit goes on, reaching and blessing all the peoples of the earth.

In the past twenty centuries, God has pursued a people from Jerusalem to Corona and beyond, following the sun from East to West. Today, the Gospel is leaping the oceans, lighting fires of faith in Korea, China, other Asian nations, and the great continent of Africa. Islam cannot stop God's pursuit. He will have His own. Hinduism, Buddhism, communism, secularism—no religion or philosophy on earth—will stand in the way of the Pursuer.

Read about His final triumph in John's Revelation. The incarnate Lord and risen Savior will win a people for Himself and rule from His throne in Jerusalem. With Christ there is no standoff. In the end, God wins. And His victory is sweet for all who are His.

The Pursuit

But He won't. Thank God! He's pursued us from day one and won't stop until He saves every human soul from that turns to Him.

Before Cain became a murderer, God sought him out and warned him of sin's controlling power. When "every intent of the thoughts of man's heart was only evil continually" (Genesis 6:5), God did not destroy humanity, until He found Noah and extended His grace to him.

God pursued Abraham, so He could bless every nation on earth through him. Jacob ran to Haran. God found and blessed him there. When Israel went down to Egypt, they left the Promised Land but couldn't escape the God who promised it to them.

The history of Israel is the story of God on the hunt. From Othniel to Samson, David to Ahab, and Hezekiah to Zedekiah, God pursued His people, while they played keep away.

The Babe in the manger was many things. Savior. Son of Man. Son of God. God the Son. But that sweet, pure little baby was quintessentially God the Hunter. The Baby Jesus came to get us and make us His own.
