Ministering Life

Such is the confidence that we have through Christ toward God. For American believers in Jesus Christ, there is an increasing heartache. The freedom forged in the Declaration of Independence and outlined in our Constitution once rang with self-evident truth. Not now. As a culture, we are using the very freedom God gave us to deny His Truth and defy His authority. And rightly, Christians mourn.

Do we look in vain?

During Jesus’ time, there were men who led society on the basis of Scripture. Their job was to look into God’s Word, distinguish right from wrong, guide God’s people according to His holy standards, and judge between the righteous and the wicked. They took their job seriously and in all sincerity, at least as far as anyone could see. Anyone, that is, except God, who looks on the heart. The ones people looked to for righteous leadership were the Pharisees and Sadducees—the very people who put our Savior to death.

It’s with good reason that the Bible warns us to watch over our hearts with all diligence. We instinctively assume that our moral compunctions are good things that lead us to do good. If there’s anyone who hungers and thirsts after righteousness, it’s us, right? Surely the problem lies with those who see things differently.

As creatures made in the image of God, humans are the highest order of being there is. But as fallen sinners, we’re opposed to the God who created us in His image, by our very nature. Rebellion is in our DNA. Words like “submit” and “obey” don’t sit well with us at all. The only judgment we like is when we’re the ones doing the judging.

As with the leaders in Christ’s day, something in us turns our highest ideals into weapons to use on others. Whether it’s the Law of Moses or the law of the land, written standards can only point us to what is right. They can never get us there. We pervert the good we long for and bring God’s just judgment crashing down on our own heads.

It’s grace that ministers life. Law can never make us right before God. Grace doesn’t tolerate sin or soothe people with lie about human goodness. What we need in our lives, in each life around us, and in every life on earth is total transformation. Like when a caterpillar turns into a butterfly or an acorn becomes an oak, death needs to happen, for true life to take place. Our sin must be killed and replaced with perfection.

The Church does not peddle a better idea. We don’t sell higher standards or superior wisdom. The advantages of righteousness—and according to God’s Word, righteousness has many advantages—don’t exist to give the Christian world-view credibility. We proclaim Christ, the wisdom of God, who tasted death for everyone and offers life to one and all. He gives His perfection and power to conquer sin.

Proclaiming this fact is our ministry of life to a world that is passing away. To the praise of God’s glory!
