Christian Character

There is a reason for spending time with God. We don't just read the Bible for mental stimulation or to get acquainted with the world's all-time bestseller. The purpose of prayer goes beyond inner reflection or getting God to give what we ask. The purpose is growth—the development of solid Christian character that endures the stresses of life and takes on the challenges of spiritual battle.

We spend time with Christ so we can know Him and be more like Him. In other words, to cultivate virtue. A complete list of all the qualities that reflect our Savior would be as infinite as He is, but there are several passages in Scripture that delineate essential virtues of the Christian life. One of the most famous lists is in Galatians 5: The Fruit of the Spirit. According to this list, here's what Christian character looks like.

- **Love:** Love is an unrelenting commitment to the good of another. It puts God above anything or anyone else and as a result puts the good of others first (1st Cor. 13; Phil. 2:1-8).
- **Joy:** Joy is an unquenchable positive outlook in every circumstance. The Holy Spirit creates joy in the believer when we trust that the good will of God will ultimately triumph, while we pursue the good of others (1 Thessalonians 5:15-16).
- **Peace:** Peace springs when we internally accept whatever happens as part of the process God uses to perfect His children. It is far from resignation to the unavoidable. Instead, peace accepts what God allows to happen and values the character God produces in us as a result (Rom. 5:1-5; 8:28-30).
- **Patience:** Patience waits for desired outcomes without complaining. It endures difficulty calmly, without letting negative emotions take control, trusting God with the ultimate outcome (James 5:7-11).

- **Kindness:** Deliberate action for the benefit of another is kindness. Kindness intentionally does others good, not harm (Acts 9:36, 39).
- **Goodness:** We call general positive moral quality, "goodness," and often notice it when it is shown by generous giving (Acts 11:22-24; Romans 5:7).
- **Faithfulness:** A faithful person is someone you can trust completely. They will never let you down (Psalm 100:5; 119:89-91). You can bet your life on it.
- **Gentleness:** The opposite of gentle is harsh. Gentleness seeks a positive effect from its actions. Although gentleness may cause pain at times—in the process of discipline for example—it never inflicts harm (Matthew 11:28-30).
- **Self-Control:** Exactly as the term implies, self-control is the ability to have complete control over one's spirit, attitudes, actions, impulses, and desires (Acts 24:25; 2 Peter 1:5-9).

The world knows virtue when it sees it but refuses to turn to God, the only source of true moral character. As a result, human attempts at virtue inevitably sour, become proud, competitive, and resentful. By nature, man exalts one virtue and neglects others. We turn the pursuit of character into a competition with winners and losers. Seeking virtue without God's enabling ultimately brings resentment toward God and conflict between one person and another. The quest for virtue apart from God is what led devout religious men to cry, "Crucify Him!" at the trial of the only virtuous man who ever lived.

True virtue is a rare commodity. It doesn't come naturally. It's a miracle of God. As the fruit of God's Spirit blossoms in His people, others notice genuine Christian character and cannot deny there is a God—and that He is at work in His people.
