The central characters of God's Word are the central characters of all history: God and Man. The conflict of the ages is the saga of God's pursuit of the human race, fleeing from a God of love. Redemption is a romance, in which God wins a people for Himself—His bride, the Church. The people God pursued from heaven to earth, to death and back is us.

As you read the Bible, rejoice. It's the story of His love for you.

By the way, speaking of the romance of redemption, have you ever puzzled over Paul's words in Ephesians 5:30-32?

We are all members of His [Christ's] body. For this reason, a man shall leave his father and mother and shall be joined to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh. This mystery is great; but I am speaking of Christ and the Church.

How can Paul's admonition to husbands and wives, telling about the marriage bond, speak some mystery about Christ's relationship with the Church? It's because God is faithful. He keeps His commitments. Our hope is sure because the God we hope in is sure. When He makes a covenant, He keeps it.

That's why marriage matters. Marriage is not about falling in love, feeling in love, or staying in love. It's about keeping our covenant like God keeps His. It's living out Christ's faithfulness in a faithless world.

That's why it's called holy matrimony.

As You Read ...

The whole reason we read the Bible is to get to know its author. The Bible reveals God's character through his actions. As you read God's Word, get to know your God by the way He works.

- See His abundant power as He creates the universe from nothing.
- Appreciate His sufficiency as He shapes and fills a formless, empty world.
- Sense His closeness in the way He fashions Adam from dust and breathes life into his nostrils.
- Know His authority from His command to His children.
- Hear the righteous indignation in His curse on human sin.
- Enter into the hope of His promise of redemption.
- Marvel at His patience, as He uses His imperfect people to accomplish His perfect plan.

The Bible is God's revelation—a communication of Himself to us. But in grace, love, and wisdom, God also tells us the whole truth about who we are and where we've gone wrong.

- By giving humans rule over the whole earth, God gives us a glimpse of what it means to be made in His image.
- His command not to eat from the tree in the middle of the garden teaches us that our fellowship with Him is a matter of choice.
- Adam's choice to disobey and eat from that tree informs us that our alienation from our Maker is our own doing.
- God's curse, Abel's murder, the death of every member of our race, all unveil the significance of that one act of disobedience.

Every Biblical account from Cain to Judas delineates the extent of the rebellion in the heart of every human being—you and I included.
