### The Path of Blessing

*Blessed is the man who walks not in the counsel of the wicked, nor stands in the way of sinners, nor sits in the seat of scoffers;*

*But his delight is in the law of the LORD, and on his law he meditates day and night.*

*He is like a tree planted by streams of water that yields its fruit in its season, and its leaf does not wither.*

*In all that he does, he prospers.*

*The wicked are not so, but are like chaff that the wind drives away.*

*Therefore the wicked will not stand in the judgment, nor sinners in the congregation of the righteous;*

*For the LORD knows the way of the righteous, but the way of the wicked will perish.*

—Psalm 1

God's Word clearly lays out the path of blessing. God blesses those who obey His will and do what is right. Disobedience and doing wrong result in a curse. The way of obedience and blessing is the way of wisdom, and Psalm 1—wisdom psalm—expresses God's wisdom clearly and succinctly.

The first step down the path of wisdom is carefully choosing the company we keep. People act like the people they're with and reflect the ideas of those who surround them. *The counsel of the wicked*, leads to wicked behavior, *the way of sinners* ends in sin, and *the seat of scoffers* is the place where righteousness is mocked to justify ungodly behavior. Observing the behavior of others and choosing godly companions supports godly character and ensures the blessings of righteous living. It's not complicated.

Turning from evil influences means turning to the influence of God's truth, and walking down the path of blessing involves a change of affection. A righteous person is more than someone who dutifully does what's right and doggedly denies the pleasures of sin. Godliness cultivates the desire for goodness, learns to *delight in the law of the LORD*, and values divine approval. Constant exposure to God's Word and the habit of meditating on His truth *day and night* develops a taste for what is good and wholesome and right. Godly appetites produce godly behavior that brings positive results.

These blessings include stability and abundance. Delighting in God's Word makes us *like a tree planted by streams of water*. The habit of going God's way develops deep roots and a refreshing supply of every need, because God is the source of all there is. And this connection to God brings *fruit in its season*, as His plan unfolds in the life of His obedient child, who *prosperes ... in all that he does*.

A good look around us in life makes the advantages of godliness clear. Although the ungodly often prosper, their lives display the instability and dysfunction of self-seeking disobedience. *They are like chaff that the wind drives away*—here today and gone tomorrow. They lack the stability that deep roots bring and the nourishment that a taproot draws from deep soil.

Life has a way of judging individual lives. The narratives of God's Word and the testimony of history show that human goodness always ultimately fails. Righteous strength drawn from God, our Creator and Lawgiver, matures into genuine character that brings personal stability and shines before others the blessings that come from going God's way.

Only one person was ever completely Godly in His life. Christ alone walked the full length of the path of wisdom. But before He received God's blessing, He took on the curse of our sin. The path of wisdom leads to Christ and receives the righteousness He bought for us on the cross.

Wisdom understands that every quest for godliness ends in failure. Jesus followed the path of blessing from heaven to earth, to the cross and the grave, then back to heaven through the resurrection, so we can receive God's righteousness and blessing by faith in Him.
