Weekly Prayer Focus

January 19, 2020

Down to the River to Pray

And on the Sabbath day we went outside the gate to the riverside, where we supposed there was a place of prayer, and we sat down and spoke to the women who had come together. One who heard us was a woman named Lydia, from the city of Thyatira, a seller of purple goods, who was a worshiper of God. The Lord opened her heart to pay attention to what was said by Paul. —Acts 16:13-14

When Lydia went down to the river to pray, she knew nothing about “that good old way” that’s sung about today. She was coming to worship God, along with some other women who gathered *on the Sabbath*. Little did Lydia or any of the women who prayed with her know what God was doing in answer to their prayers. But He had been working mightily behind the scenes. God had a people to save.

Paul and Silas and Timothy had been traveling around what we now call Turkey, pursuing a path for the Gospel with only a sense of where not to go. For reasons entirely unknown to them, the Holy Spirit stopped them at every turn. They stayed in the familiar *region of Phrygia and Galatia*, because the Holy Spirit wouldn’t let them go west and enter Asia. When they tried moving north to Bythina, on the Black Sea, the *Spirit of Jesus did not allow them*.

We don’t know how God led them or communicated His guidance, but His “No” was definite. They had to turn west again and travel through Mysia, until they came to Troas—ancient Troy. There, Paul had a vision of a man urging him to “*Come over to Macedonia and help us.*” Finally, God’s leading was clear, so they entered Europe for the first time and ended up in the proud Roman city of Philippi—where Lydia lived.

Finding no Jewish synagogue there, Paul joined the prayer meeting outside the city gate, down by the river, and he preached the Gospel there. Lydia’s prayers were answered, when *the Lord opened her heart to believe the Gospel*. When Lydia and her household were baptized, the Philippian church was born.

As we pray, we may have a sense of what we need or desire, but we have no idea of the role our prayers play in the divine scheme of events. We worship Almighty God, and the Lord who hears our prayers superintends all the events of heaven and earth. Our prayers are an integral part of divine superintendence, as God *works all things according to the counsel of His will* (Ephesians 1:11a).

Undistracted by the functions of the universe, the Lord listened intently to the prayers of a *seller of purple goods* and brought His apostles from Asia to Europe to meet her need. Praise God for answered prayer! God’s mysterious, purposeful guidance led Paul and his companions to Lydia. Her soul was saved, a church was planted, and the work of the Gospel continued to unfold.

Little did Lydia know the outcome of her prayers. No one could anticipate the spiritual confrontation, the souls saved, and the lives changed as a result. Perhaps one consequence will come from Lydia’s prayer in our day, when we learn to sing the old Gospel chorus with new faith—faith and prayers for our day.
