Weekly Prayer Focus

March 29, 2020

God's Treasure Within

If you then, who are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will the heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him!" —Luke 11:13

Prayer is powerful, because God is powerful, and prayer lays hold of Him. Apparently Jesus' disciples recognized the connection between Jesus' power and His prayer life when they asked Him to teach them to pray. His response to their question includes a sample prayer (the "Lord's Prayer") and two parables. It addresses exactly what we, Jesus' disciples today, need in order to accomplish the work He called us to do.

Jesus' sample prayer (Luke 11:2-4) focuses first on honoring God the Father and serving His kingdom above all things. Then it expresses to our dependence on Him for all our physical and spiritual needs. Our most essential needs—our daily bread, forgiveness for sins, and deliverance from temptation—are supplied by God. Prayer reminds us of our greatest need—the need to realize our need of God. Dependence on Him is the foundation of spiritual power. It was true for Jesus, so it's certainly true for us.

Jesus' parable of the friend at midnight (11:5-8) illustrates this point. When a guest appeared at his door in the middle of the night, this man had nothing to give him. Knowing he had nothing to offer, he implored his neighbor to loan him some bread. In desperation, he refused to give up until he got what he came for.

When we pray, we admit we have nothing to offer. This fact cuts against the grain of our self-confidence and offends our natural pride. But Jesus frankly expressed our utter dependence on Him for everything. *I am the vine; you are the branches. Whoever abides in me and I in him, he it is that bears much fruit, for apart from me you can do nothing* (John 15:5).

By its very nature, prayer is a confession of dependence on God. It's repentance from our essential sin of rebellious self-sufficiency. Prayer admits our need of God, turns from self-direction to submission, and allows God to be God in our lives. Because God alone is our Creator and Provider, prayer reestablishes us in a right relationship with Him. Prayer is about reconnecting before it's about receiving.

And since we have God's promise to provide, we can pray persistently, insistently, and expectantly. *And I tell you, ask, and it will be given to you; seek, and you will find; knock, and it will be opened to you. For everyone who asks receives, and the one who seeks finds, and to the one who knocks it will be opened* (Luke 11:9-10).

But we don't pray to an annoyed neighbor who doesn't want to be bothered. God is a good Father, who gives His children *good gifts*. God never pulls a fast one and answers our prayers with something worthless or harmful (11:11-13). We can always trust Him to give what's best, even when it doesn't seem that way.

In fact, He's already given us the best possible gift. We just need to remember to make use of it. Christ promised to send the Holy Spirit to live within His people. The Holy Spirit is God's life flowing through the spiritual veins of His people. He guarantees our salvation (2nd Corinthians 1:22). His presence in us assures us that we belong to Christ (2nd Timothy 2:19). He empowers our ministry (Acts 1:8), reveals the truth of God's Word to us (2nd Corinthians 2:12-13), gives us joy (1st Thessalonians 1:6), and bears righteous fruit in our lives (Galatians 5:22-23). And the Holy Spirit is always with us (John 14:18; Hebrews 13:5b).

Prayer is not about what we need. It's about all that God has to supply. It's not about lack. It's about abundance. It's about more than our inability. It's about God's infinite ability—right at our fingertips. So we can pursue the work of His kingdom with utter confidence and joy.

To the praise of His glory.

Prayer for the Week

Prayer Outcomes

Easter is coming. It was during this Season of Redemption that Jesus Christ purchased the privilege of coming to Him in prayer with His blood. Prayer is a significant act—a God-given opportunity to take part in the great work He is accomplishing in the world. On the night before He died, Jesus told us His purpose for giving us access to The Father.

While these vaunted civilizations impress the history buff, to God they are like a speck of dust on the scales. In the pages of Scripture, history shows the One Who "rules the world with truth and grace and makes the nations prove the glories of His righteousness and wonders of His love." History reveals Jesus Christ, the King of kings.

As you read God's Word, look for Christ on every page.

Jesus said to them, "O foolish men and slow of heart to believe in all that the prophets have spoken! "Was it not necessary for the Christ to suffer these things and to enter into His glory?" Then beginning with Moses and with all the prophets, He explained to them the things concerning Himself in all the Scriptures. —Luke 24:25-27

These Testify about Me.

The Bible is the Book of Books, but it's more than just a book. It's a testimony about God's work, which began before the world, shapes all of time, and leads to eternity. From cover to cover, the Bible tells about Jesus Christ: Creator, Redeemer, coming King.

Most would call the Bible a book of religion or philosophy—a claim to truth in the arena of ideas. Certainly, like other religious books, it contains moral values, principles to follow, prescribed rituals and sacrifices.

But God's Word doesn't stop with rituals and prescriptions for righteous behavior. It relentlessly reveals an awful truth we dare not face. It confronts the harsh, undeniable reality of sin—our utter inability, even refusal, to live by what God defines as right.

As it reveals the heartbreak of humanity, Scripture also unfolds a story of hope. A hope that God put there. It's the hope of a Redeemer, who is the Truth. He performed all the rituals, followed all the principles, and embodied God's perfect righteousness.

But Jesus was more than a perfect example. He became the perfect sacrifice. The truth is that there is nothing God expects of us that He is not willing to do Himself. He proved this when His Son died for sin. The Bible testifies to Christ's triumph over our sin, as He surrendered His will—and His life—to obey His Father.

You will never find a better work of literature than the Bible. Its verbal artistry is beyond compare. But its beauty doesn't account for why no book in history has sold more copies. The

His life as a sacrifice for our sins. People don't sacrifice themselves for their enemies. Jesus did. He paid a price beyond imagination in order to buy back a world that belonged to Him by right. To make things the way they were meant to be.

Sickness and death were not meant to be. The God of life filled the world with life then gave up His life for that world. But He wasn't meant to stay dead. Jesus came back to life and conquered death, to make things right—like they ought to be. Easter celebrates the essence of our faith. The King of Creation purchased us from slavery to sin with His blood. Then He broke the chains of death to destroy the devil on his own turf. Jesus Christ is King by creation, King by purchase, and King by conquest. That's what we celebrate at Easter.

Palm fronds fanned the April breeze. A crowd gathered along the road, eyes wide with anticipation. People stood tiptoe trying to see a man riding humbly on the back of a donkey, without pretense or grandeur. The beast of burden stepped hesitantly across coats and articles of clothing, an impromptu red carpet in honor of Jesus. He was worthy of their cry: *Hosanna to the Son of David; Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord; Hosanna in the highest.*

And that praise goes on, from Jesus' resurrection and ascension, through the Church Age, up until now. Join the chorus of praise to your Creator, Redeemer, and King. He is worthy to have all people in all the earth sing His praise for all eternity. So start *now*. THIS is how things are meant to be.

Behold, your King is coming to you, gentle and mounted on a donkey, even a colt, the foal of a beast of burden. Hosanna to the Son of David; Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord; Hosanna in the highest. —Matthew 21:5 & 9

How Things Were Meant to Be

Waves caressing the shore. The breeze brushing my face. The rocks of the jetty glistening in the sun and bristling with fishermen. With all of the week's work done, I was on vacation, so I was free to watch boats cruise by and listen to the children shriek with joy on the beach. We were celebrating my daughter's birthday, surrounded by family and friends. THAT's how things are meant to be! But that was then—Not now.

We have so much to praise God for! Our good God made a good world then created us to enjoy Him and the world. *"Shout joyfully to the Lord, all the earth. Serve the Lord with gladness. ... Know that the Lord Himself is God. It is He who made us, and not we ourselves"* (Psalm 100:1-3). There are moments, when we're so surrounded by His goodness we just have to rejoice. I wish it were always that way.

But it's Not always that way. Yes, we have seasons that remind us God's goodness and why He deserves our praise. Times like we're having now remind us that the world is broken, and God uses things like pandemics to jolt us into awareness. Try as we might to deny it, the world is precarious and life ends in death. It's God's grace that reminds us of that fact and nudges us—and sometimes pushes us—up against the ugly realities that sin brings. His grace is even in COVID 19.
