

Now, That's the Spirit!

But I say, walk by the Spirit, and you will not gratify the desires of the flesh. For the desires of the flesh are against the Spirit, and the desires of the Spirit are against the flesh, for these are opposed to each other, to keep you from doing the things you want to do. But if you are led by the Spirit, you are not under the law. —Galatians 5:1, 5, 13-14

The Christian life of isn't performed. It's received—just like our salvation. The solution to the mystery of the ages is that the character, behavior, and lifestyle every person knows we must follow is humanly impossible. This is the agonizing failure of our race. Every religion prescribes good behavior and holds up moral ideals, but the Christian receives and lives the righteousness of Christ by faith alone.

Paul puts it like this: For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God, not a result of works, so that no one may boast. For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them (Ephesians 2:8-10). A Christian is saved by grace, through faith, unto good works. It's all from God.

Jesus said essentially the same thing in different words: Either make the tree good and its fruit good, or make the tree bad and its fruit bad, for the tree is known by its fruit. ... How can you speak good, when you are evil? For out of the abundance of the heart the mouth speaks. The good person out of his good treasure brings forth good, and the evil person out of his evil treasure brings forth evil (Matthew 12:33-35).

It's not that Christians don't strive, but we live by the power and at the direction of the only perfect person who's ever lived, trusting in the Holy Spirit whom He sent to live within all who believe in Jesus Christ. Paul contrasts living in our own strength by relying on the Holy Spirit in Galatians 5.

Living by the Flesh means ...

- Being enslaved to the law (5:1)
- Required to keep the whole law (5:2)
- Bound by rituals (5:6a)
- Severed from Christ and fallen from grace (5:4)
- Operating as the world does (5:7-8)
- Biting, devouring, and consuming others (5:15)
- Gratifying the desires of the flesh (5:16)
- Conceited, provoking and envying others (5:26)

Walking in the Spirit means ...

- Living free in Christ (5:1, 2)
- Living in the hope of righteousness (5:5b)
- Faith works through love (5:6b)
- Being confident in the Lord (5:10a)
- Being an offense to the world (5:11)
- Free to serve others through love (5:13-14)
- Doing what we deeply desire to do (5:17b)
- Living in step with the Holy Spirit (5:25)

By Their Fruit:

Jesus said, Beware of false prophets, who come to you in sheep's clothing but inwardly are ravenous wolves. You will recognize them by their fruits. Are grapes gathered from thornbushes, or figs from thistles? So, every healthy tree bears good fruit, but the diseased tree bears bad fruit. A healthy tree cannot bear bad fruit, nor can a diseased tree bear good fruit. Every tree that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire. Thus you will recognize them by their fruits (Matthew 7:15-20).

What human effort produces: Now the works of the flesh are evident: sexual immorality, impurity, sensuality, idolatry, sorcery, enmity, strife, jealousy, fits of anger, rivalries, dissensions, divisions, envy, drunkenness, orgies, and things like these. I warn you, as I warned you before, that those who do such things will not inherit the kingdom of God (Galatians 5:18-21).

What the Spirit of God produces: But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control; against such things there is no law (Galatians 5:22-23).

Jesus makes the believer new, so we can live a new life to the praise of His glory.
