

LORD Knows

The hand of the LORD was upon me, and he brought me out in the Spirit of the LORD and set me down in the middle of the valley; it was full of bones. And he led me around among them, and behold, there were very many on the surface of the valley, and behold, they were very dry. And he said to me, "Son of man, can these bones live?" And I answered, "O Lord GOD, you know." –Ezekiel 37:1-3

A favorite verse we use on others is, *Judge not, that you be not judged* (Matthew 7:1). There are lots of things to say about judging, but one thing is clear. Judgment happens. It happened in the past, will happen in the future, and it looks like it's happening it now. Most likely, things will not quite be the same again.

Judgment is God's way of getting us to look up instead of looking around to get our bearings and find hope. It's really true, Christian. We're not of this world. We don't evaluate things just by what's happening. We look to God in His Word, follow His Spirit's guidance, draw strength from His Church, take assurance from His sovereign goodness. He'll see us through whatever life throws at us and bring us safely to heaven.

Ezekiel was only about thirty when his homeland was invaded and he was hauled off in chains to a distant and very foreign land. Jerusalem—his hometown—had been called "the joy of the whole earth." Now it was leveled, its temple burned, and its entire population either dead or deported. They'd had a good run, but sin and the worship of fake gods had severed them from the One True God. Hope was gone.

At times like that, God makes His most audacious promises and does the most outlandish things. Something in the Name "Yahweh," or "Jehovah," connotes the idea, "You ain't seen nothing yet." Through Ezekiel, God told His people, *I will vindicate the holiness of my great name, which has been profaned among the nations, and which you have profaned among them. And the nations will know that I am the LORD, declares the Lord GOD, when through you I vindicate my holiness before their eyes* (Ezekiel 36:23). God's reputation was at stake, so despite all appearances, God's people still had a future and a hope.

Ezekiel's famous vision of the valley of dry bones was God's vivid way of reassuring Israel of their hope for new life. That's why the LORD posed the question, *son of man*—you weak and simple human—*can these bones live?* (37:3a), in a way that challenged the prophet's budding faith. Ezekiel responded with simple, open-ended trust. *O Lord GOD, you know* (37:3b).

Like a son, whose loving Dad included him in a major task, Ezekiel heard the Lord tell him, "Prophesy over these bones, and say to them, O dry bones, hear the word of the LORD. Thus says the Lord GOD to these bones: Behold, I will cause breath to enter you, and you shall live. And I will lay sinews upon you, and will cause flesh to come upon you, and cover you with skin, and put breath in you, and you shall live, and you shall know that I am the LORD" (37:4b-6). Not only was that prediction audacious, it's exactly what happened.

So I prophesied as I was commanded. And as I prophesied, there was a sound, and behold, a rattling, and the bones came together, bone to its bone. And I looked, and behold, there were sinews on them, and flesh had come upon them, and skin had covered them. But there was no breath in them. Then he said to me, "Prophesy to the breath; prophesy, son of man, and say to the breath, Thus says the Lord GOD: Come from the four winds, O breath, and breathe on these slain, that they may live." So I prophesied as he commanded me, and the breath came into them, and they lived and stood on their feet, an exceedingly great army (37:7-10).

We are God's army. Today, it's the Church who's the people of God—not the United States but Christians everywhere on earth. Like the prophet Ezekiel, we, the people of the Lord GOD Almighty, will play a part in His great work. As American citizens, we work to save our country, but as Christians, we hope only in the risen Christ.

The Lord knows His plans. He's able to restore what's lost and repair what's broken. If He chooses to keep using our nation—and He can—it will be through those who trust in Christ alone.

Prayer for the Week

- *Thursday (Our Nation):* Ask God to work through you, as a member of His Church, to influence our country to turn to His righteousness, so we can receive His blessings once again. *Righteousness exalts a nation, but sin is a reproach to any people* (Proverbs 14:34).
- *Friday (The World):* Ask god to guide you, and Northpoint as a church, to bring the Gospel to those around you and to the ends of the earth. *Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age (Matthew 28:19-20).*
- Saturday (Praise and Rejoicing): Praise God the we are not alone and do not labor in vain in the Lord. Now to him who is able to do far more abundantly than all that we ask or think, according to the power at work within us, to him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus throughout all generations, forever and ever. Amen (Ephesians 3:20-21).
