BEHOLD YOUR GODS

1 Kings 12:25-33

Dr. Tony Chute, Lead Pastor

Overview: Rehoboam's refusal to listen to the advice of his people leads to division in Israel, resulting in two countries with two kings. Jeroboam became king of the northern kingdom and immediately established Shechem as the new capital while fortifying Peniel for added protection. He realizes that people in the northern kingdom will be inclined to travel to Jerusalem to offer sacrifices at the temple, so he provides alternate places of worship in the northernmost and southernmost regions of his country. In addition, he provides alternate forms of worship, including temples at high places, priests from among the people, and feasts that mirror those in Judah. Although Jeroboam's decisions are politically astute, they are an affront to God because the result was a false religion altogether. By considering Jeroboam's actions in this passage, we are able to discover the marks of false religion and, by contrast, we are able to discern the marks of true religion as it relates to the claims of Christianity.
